MINUTES FROM MEETING HELD February 20, 2023

I. Approval of Agenda

Members received and reviewed written copies of the February 20, 2023 agenda. The agenda was approved unanimously as follows:

Board members unanimously elected the appointees for 2023 above on the previous motions.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

A. Approval of Minutes - December 19, 2022

Members received and reviewed written copies of the minutes from the December 19, 2022 meeting. The minutes were approved unanimously as follows:

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Financial & Operational Reports

Status of Accounts – December 2022 & January 2023
 Dirk Verhoeff reviewed the status of accounts for December 2022. Revenues ended 12% above budget for 2022. All revenue line items were above budget with the exception of Landfill Gas. Revenues for 2023 are at budget through January 2023. The primary landfill operations budget ended under budget for 2022. Dirk stated that the Authority saw a net profit for the year.

2. Rainfall Report

Dirk Verhoeff reviewed the rainfall data through December 2022. Dirk reported that we received above normal rainfall five months out of the year. We ended the year 6% above normal.

3. Carpet Capital 10 Miler

Dirk briefed the Board on the goal to revive the Carpet Capital 10 Miler run along Highway 2 and McGaughey Chapel Road in Whitfield County. Race Director, Will Musto, coordinated and held the race in December 2022. He experienced a lot of traffic along McGaughey Chapel road, even when utilizing Whitfield County Sheriff's department to partially close roads. Will has approached Dirk Verhoeff requesting that we close or delay the opening of the McGaughey Chapel Road Convenience Center to accommodate the race route. In addition, he will be contacting Whitfield County Sheriff's Department about closing the road completely during the race. The Solid Waste Authority Board is open to having a delayed opening at the MCG location. The race begins at 9 AM and usually last two hours. MCG would open at 11 AM rather than 7 AM. It is Dirk's understanding that if the road cannot be completely shut down, the race would not occur.

4. MRF Elevated Sort Line Design/Build Approval

Dirk Verhoeff informed the Board that the SWA only received one quote for an elevated sort line to be installed in the MRF building located at the Old Dixie Hwy. Landfill. Dirk also remined the Board that the Authority received a \$90k grant from Georgia EPD to go towards the project. Michael Foxx explained how the sort line would increase productivity and could possibly be used for dual stream recycling in the future. The Authority would be responsible for dropping power for the new equipment.

Members received and reviewed written copies of a quote from Marathon for an elevated sort line in the amount of \$423,769.00 to be installed at the MRF. The purchase was approved unanimously as follows:

5. MRF Fork-Truck Purchase

Members were presented, and reviewed, three quotes for a fork-lift truck for the MRF. Dirk recommended Bailey Company because delivery from the lowest bidder would be in 2024. The purchase was approved unanimously as follows:

B. Construction / Special Project Reports

Phase 6 Cell 6 MSW Landfill Construction Update
 Seth Lassitter updated the Board on the Cell 6 landfill construction. Seth
 stated that the contractor has completed about half (1,500 ft) of the perimeter
 stormwater ditch. In addition, all of the perimeter environmental monitoring
 wells have been constructed and baseline ground water monitoring has been
 started. Finally, clay liner installation has started and the permeability test
 results have been passing.

- 2. MRF Permit Major Modification (Sort Line / 5-year permit update) Dirk Verhoeff informed the Board that the installation of an elevated sort line in the MRF changes the processes outline in the Design & Operational plans/permit. Because of this, a major modification of the D&O plans is required per Georgia EPD rule. Therefore, the Authority will be required to submit a major modification, update the D&O plans and hold public hearings to insure there is no opposition. In addition, the Dalton-Whitfield Solid Waste Management Plan, requires that the Authority Board to issue a recommendation and conformance letter to the Whitfield County Board of Commissioners since the project is in Whitfield County.
- 3. Balefill Expansion Update Dirk Verhoeff briefed the Board on the progress of the Balefill expansion. As mentioned in past meetings, the expansion will impair some waters of the State and requires mitigation. New information provided by the ecologist/engineers requires us to get a US Army Corps of Engineers individual permit which can take 12 to 18 months. A streamlined Nationwide permit is not an option due to past impacts of wetland and streams from Phase 6 MSW construction.
- 4. MRF Water Line Project
 Dirk Verhoeff remined the Board that the 4-inch plastic water line that feeds the MRFs fire suppression system need to be replaced. Two leaks had to be repaired last year and we should expect more failures to come. Ellis Contracting provided at quote to replace the line via. directional bore of approximately 1,500 ft in the amount of \$62,500.00. The Board requested a revised quote to trench the line and to get additional quotes from other contractors.
