II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Financial & Operational Reports

1. Status of Accounts – March 2022 Dirk Verhoeff reviewed the status of accounts for March 2022. Dirk mentioned that the GRANTS line number need to be moved to the RECYCLING REVENUE line. All revenue line items were above budget with the exception of Landfill Gas, interest income and Miscellaneous Revenue. Dirk again pointed out that there have been no encumbrances from the Leachate Transportation and Disposal line item because City of Dalton Finance has been applying it to the utilities line item. Dirk has requested the finance department to correct the error. Dirk also mentioned that a budget amendment will be needed to account for the significant increase in fuel and gasoline costs.

2. Rainfall Report

Dirk Verhoeff reviewed the rainfall data through April 14, 2022. Dirk reported that we received 102% of normal rainfall in March and currently at 70% of normal for April.

B. Construction / Special Project Report

1. Cell 6 Construction Update

Seth Lassitter provided a progress update for the Phase 6 Cell 6 landfill construction. The draft construction drawings, E&S Plan drawings and RFP package have been reviewed and approved. The receipt of drainage material is a little behind schedule. We will convey our concerns to the supplier and transporter. There was some discussion regarding delivery deadline. Dirk mentioned that the quote/agreement likely has date range specifying delivery by quarry.

2. Landfill Gas Project

Dirk Verhoeff informed the board that he met with Trinseo to discuss potential to deliver landfill gas. Dirk provided to Trinseo cost estimates to get collection and delivery equipment up and running in order to provide gas. It would be preferred for Trinseo to cover these costs and perform future repairs. No agreement was made with Trinseo and the discussion will continue.



The Dalton-Whitfield Solid Waste Authority (Owner) is accepting Sealed Proposals, for furnishing all materials, labor, tools, equipment, and appurtenances necessary for the construction of the Old Dixie HWY MSW Landfill Phase 6, Stage 6, Cell Construction. The proposals will be received by the Owner at the 587 Gazaway Road, Dalton, GA 30721, Attention: Dirk Verhoeff, until, but no later than 2:00 pm, local time, on May 31, 2022, and then at said office publicly opened, with only the names of Proposers read aloud.

The Project consists of construction of approximately: 28,762 CY of excavation, 6,583 CY of structural fill; 346,710 SF of compacted soil liner, HDPE geomembrane, GCL and leachate collection layer; 633 LF of leachate collection line; 1,875 LF of dual-contained HDPE forcemain; leachate sumps and forcemain manholes; sediment pond cleaning; 4,440 square yards of access road, 600 LF on concrete channel, and erosion and sedimentation control items.

A mandatory Pre-Proposal Conference will be held for all Proposers at 11:00 am, local time, on May 17, 2022, at the Landfill Office at 587 Gazaway Road, Dalton, GA 30721. All proposers must attend all of the Pre-Proposal Conference. Any proposer that does not attend the Pre-Proposal Conference will be disqualified from proposing and their submittal will not be accepted.

The work will be awarded in one Contract.



During the month of April 2022 all of the schools recycling with Target Recycling collected a total of 54,460 pounds of recyclable materials for a recycling rate of 2.5 pounds per student.

Target Recycling, managed by the Dalton-Whitfield Solid Waste Authority's Recycling Center in Dalton, provides collection of recyclables at no charge to local businesses and schools interested in recycling. Recycling collection saves local school districts hundreds of dollars in waste collection fees each month.





City of Dalton Curbside Recycling Report - April 2022

The City of Dalton Curbside Recycling Program collected 74.6 tons (149,160 lbs.) of recyclables in April 2022. It's a 2.9% decrease compared to April 2021 when 76.8 tons were collected. 74.6 tons saves 124 cubic yards of landfill space. 872.6 tons (1,745,200 lbs.) of garbage was disposed of in April 2022 by the City of Dalton. It's a decrease of 6.1% compared

to 929.7 tons collected in April 2021. The waste diversion rate for April 2022 is 7.88%. The Dalton-Whitfield Solid Waste Authority has credited the City of Dalton Public Works Department \$2,237.40 for the revenue sharing of recyclables received in April 2022.
